

ORDER OF SERVICE

GATHERING IN GOD'S NAME

The Celebrant greets the people.

✠ Blessed be God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
Blessed be God's kingdom, now and for ever.

The Lord be with you.
And also with you.

If you, O Lord, should note what we do wrong, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with you, so that you may be revered.

All say together,

**Almighty God,
to whom all hearts are open,
all desires known,
and from whom no secrets are hidden:
cleanse the thoughts of our hearts
by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit,
that we may perfectly love you,
and worthily magnify your holy name,
through Christ our Lord. Amen.**

THE PENITENTIAL RITE

To prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries, let us confess our sins in penitence and faith.

**Merciful God,
our maker and our judge,
we have sinned against you in thought,
word and deed, and in what we have failed to do:
we have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves;
we repent, and are sorry for all our sins.
Father, forgive us.
Strengthen us to love and obey you
in newness of life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

Almighty God,
who has promised forgiveness
to all who turn to him in faith:
✠ pardon you and set you free from all your sins,
strengthen you in all goodness,
and keep you in eternal life,
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Gloria in Excelsis is said.

**Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to God's people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.
Lord Jesus Christ,**

**only Son of the Father,
Lord God, lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world,
have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.
For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit,
in the ✠ glory of God the Father. Amen.**

All sit for the readings.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

THE FIRST READING

All stand for the Holy Gospel.

THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, **alleluia.**

I give you a new commandment:
love one another as I have loved you.
alleluia.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

All sit.

THE SERMON

All stand to join in saying

THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church:

**We believe in one God,
the Father, the almighty
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.**
**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God, begotten, not made,
of one being with the Father;
through him all things were made.
For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven,**

was incarnate of the Holy Spirit
and the virgin Mary
and became truly human.
For our sake he was crucified
under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory to judge
the living and the dead
and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord and giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son
is worshipped and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism
for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead,
✠ and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The people kneel for the prayers.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

The Celebrant introduces the prayers.

Let us pray for the world and the Church.

Prayers are offered, concluding with,

Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers.
**Grant that what we have asked in faith
we may by your grace receive,
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

All stand immediately for the greeting.

THE GREETING OF PEACE

We are the body of Christ.
His Spirit is with us.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.
And also with you.

All sit for the Offertory.

Music for the Offertory.

*When the preparation of the gifts is completed,
the Celebrant says the following prayer*

OFFERTORY PRAYER

Lord,
hear the prayers of your people
and receive our gifts.
May the worship of each one here
bring salvation to all.
We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Father, we give you thanks and praise
through your beloved Son Jesus Christ,
your living Word,
through whom you have created all things;
who was sent by you in your great goodness
to be our Saviour.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh;
as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin,
he lived on earth and went about among us;
he opened wide his arms for us on the cross;
he put an end to death by dying for us;
and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life;
so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.
Therefore with angels and archangels,
and with all the company of heaven,
we proclaim your great and glorious name,
for ever praising you and saying:

Santus and Benedictus are sung on our behalf by a Cantor.

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.**

**✠ Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness;
grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit,
and according to your holy will,
these gifts of bread and wine
may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;
who, in the same night that he was betrayed,
took bread and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.
In the same way, after supper
he took the cup and gave you thanks;
he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.

**Christ has died:
Christ is risen:
Christ will come again.**

And so, Father,
calling to mind his death on the cross,
his perfect sacrifice
made once for the sins of the whole world;
rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension,
and looking for his coming in glory,
we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving,
we bring before you this bread and this cup
and we thank you for counting us worthy
to stand in your presence and serve you.

✠ Send the Holy Spirit on your people
and gather into one in your kingdom
all who share this one bread and one cup,
so that we,
in the company of [*N and*] all the saints,
may praise and glorify you for ever,
through Jesus Christ our Lord;
by whom, and with whom, and in whom,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all honour and glory be yours,
almighty Father,
for ever and for ever.

**✠ Blessing and honour and glory and power
are yours for ever and ever. Amen.**

After a short silence the Celebrant says,

As our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are confident to pray,

**Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial**

**and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power
and the glory are yours
now and for ever. Amen.**

Lord Jesus Christ,
you said to your apostles,
I leave you peace, my peace I give you.
Look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church,
and grant us the peace and unity of your kingdom
where you live for ever and ever. **Amen.**

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.
We who are many are one body.
For we all share in the one bread.

Agnus Dei is sung on our behalf by a Cantor.

**Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us.
Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us.
Jesus, redeemer of the world, grant us your peace.**

The Celebrant invites the people to receive Holy Communion

Jesus is the Lamb of God that takes away the sins of the world.
Happy are those who are called to his supper.
**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

*Please sanitise your hands using the hand wipe provided
before coming forward for Holy Communion.
Move under the direction of the Stewards via the main aisle
and return by the Kennerley Aisle.*

Candles can be lit at the conclusion of the Mass.

*If you would prefer not to receive Holy Communion at this time,
please remain in your seat
and make an Act of Spiritual Communion using the following prayers.*

Blessed Jesus,
present in the Most Holy Sacrament.
I love you above all things,
and I desire to receive you into my soul
by faith with thanksgiving.
I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally,
but come spiritually into my heart, I pray.
I embrace you as if you were already there
and unite myself wholly to you.
Never let me be separated from you. Amen.

Come, Lord Jesus,
and dwell in my heart in the fullness of your strength;
be my wisdom and guide me in rights pathways;
conform my life and actions to the image of your holiness;
and, in the power of your gracious might,
rule over every hostile power that threatens or disturbs
the growth of your kingdom;
who with the Father and the Holy Spirit,
lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting. **Amen.**

THE POST COMMUNION

The Celebrant says,

O God, how much we value your mercy! All people can gather under your protection.

Almighty God,
you have taught us through your Son
that love is the fulfilling of the law:
grant that,
through the grace of this most holy sacrament,
we may love you with our whole heart
and our neighbours as ourselves;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Most loving God,
you send us into the world you love;
give us grace to go thankfully and with courage
in the power of your Spirit.

All stand for the Blessing and Dismissal.

The peace of God
which passes all understanding,
keep your hearts and minds
in the knowledge and love of God,
and of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord;
and the blessing of God almighty,
the ✠ Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit,
be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.
In the name of Christ. Amen.
